# EGYPTIAN AREA SCHOOLS EMPLOYEE BENEFIT TRUST BOARD OF MANAGERS MEETING NOTES CARLYLE, ILLINOIS MARCH 21, 2012

### I. CALL TO ORDER:

A meeting of the Board of Managers of the Egyptian Area Schools Employee Benefit Trust was held on Wednesday, March 21, 2012, at Governor's Run in Carlyle. Chairman Jeff Dosier called the meeting to order at approximately 10:00 a.m. Jeff asked attendees to introduce themselves. Roll call showed 84 people in attendance, including 70 representatives from 61 districts and 14 advisors and guests.

The notes of the Board of Managers meeting of December 7, 2011 were approved as submitted.

## II. FINANCIAL REPORT:

Tom Dahncke reviewed the Trust's financial statements as of January 31, 2012. He stated that February was another strong positive month. For the current fiscal year, the Trust had negative cash flow for July and August, but the premium rate increase went into effect in September and claims have been trending better, with the result that the Fund balance has improved by over \$4.5 million through February.

Tom stated that audited financial statements for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2011 are now on the Trust's website and hard copies were available to be picked up at the meeting. He explained that the financials were delayed for the actuarial valuation required to meet the requirements of GASB 43 and 45. Information to assist district auditors with GASB reporting has also been posted on the Trust's website. The GASB information was also distributed with the agenda for the meeting.

Chad Stafko from Regions Bank stated that the Trust now has almost \$4 million in investment assets, all invested in cash and fixed income investments with maturities of less than five years. It appears that interest rates may be starting to move up so the Trust will be well positioned to take advantage of rising rates.

# III. BUSINESS ITEMS:

### A. <u>Report of TPA Services – Meritain Health.</u>

Karen Giles reported that the spring newsletter would be issued the following week and posted on the Trust's website. The annual bookkeeper meetings have been scheduled for Wednesday through Friday, July 25 through 27, at the same three locations in Effingham, Rend Lake and Fairview Heights. Karen reported that Consult A Doctor had over 1000 calls from Trust members from September through December 2011.

# B. <u>Report of Prescription Drug Services – Express Scripts/ScripWorld</u>.

Jessica Renfeldt introduced Don Bishop, a new clinical pharmacist with ScripWorld. Don said he is originally from Waukeegan, Illinois and was with Aetna for 9 years before joining ScripWorld after Aetna acquired its parent company.

Jessica reported that Express Scripts communicated with about 2200 Trust members by telephone and by mail, erroneously informing them they were required to use mail order for maintenance drugs for scripts filled after January 1, 2012. Express Scripts has corrected the error in its system and sent a letter to those members who were contacted. Jessica invited members to contact her following the meeting with any specific questions about the prescription drug benefit.

## C. <u>Report of Dental Services – Delta Dental</u>.

Deb Ulmer reported that Delta Dental offers an archive of information on different wellness topics. Members should contact her to access this information.

### D. <u>Report of PPO Services – HealthLink</u>.

Susan Lehne reported that Midwest Orthopedics in Peoria joined the HealthLink network effective March 15, 2012. Soderstrom, a dermatology practice in Peoria, has also joined the network. HealthLink also renewed contracts with the St. Louis Tenet hospitals, Saint Louis University and DesPeres Hospitals, effective retroactive to January 1, 2012, so there was no lapse in network participation for these hospitals.

Susan provided a handout describing case management and what a case manager does. She stated that members may also request case management from HealthLink if the member has been diagnosed with a disease or medical condition that is appropriate for case management. Susan also offered to provide health and wellness calendars, pedometers, nutritional pamphlets and other wellness information for districts to distribute to employees. Districts may contact Susan to request these.

Susan stated that she is also the representative for the Uniview voluntary vision program. She reminded members that annual eye exams are covered only every 12 months, determined by calendar days. Members need to schedule their exams for a date that is not less than 12 months to the day after the prior year exam.

### E. <u>Report of Actuary – Optum Insight</u>

Jim Drennan stated that claims for the current year are better than he projected. Claims continue to increase, but at a much slower rate than last year. He predicts the fund balance is likely to remain about even through the end of the current fiscal year. If that occurs, the rate increase required will be much lower than last year, perhaps below a double digit increase.

### F. <u>Report of Benefits Committee</u>.

Matt Klosterman reported that the Benefits Committee had met twice since the December Board meeting and would be meeting again following the Board of Managers meeting and on April 11 and 19. The Committee does not yet have specific recommendations, but is considering a number of different issues. Matt invited members to contact him with any topics they want the Committee to consider. The Committee's recommendations for benefit changes and premium rates will be distributed to members in advance of the May 9 meeting.

# G. <u>Report of Flexible Benefits Administration – American Fidelity</u>.

David Hefner stated that American Fidelity handles HSA administration for districts with American Fidelity health savings accounts (HSAs). American Fidelity is available to assist districts in educating employees about how a high deductible health plan, such as the Trust's Bronze Plan, works with an HSA.

David also stated that American Fidelity can assist districts that are American Fidelity customers with the new W-2 reporting requirements. Employers will be required to include the value of health coverage on W-2 forms issued in January 2013 for the 2012 calendar year.

David also noted that some schools have received inquiries from IRS about their 403(b) plans. As a service to Trust members, American Fidelity is available to assist districts in preparing a response for IRS even if the district is not currently an American Fidelity 403(b) plan customer.

### H. Nominating Committee.

Jeff Dosier appointed Matt Klosterman to chair the Nominating Committee and develop a slate of nominees to succeed members of the Executive Committee whose terms expire in June. Jeff asked Executive Committee members whose terms expire this year to let Matt know whether they are willing to serve another 3-year term on the Executive Committee.

# IV. NEXT MEETINGS AND ADJOURNMENT:

The final meeting for the year is scheduled for Wednesday, May 9, 2012.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
